Professor. He is currently researching the radicalization process and recruitment into violent political extremism as well as ways to counter this process (Countering Violent Extremism). This work has resulted in academic publications and presentations as well as reports and briefings for the U.S. government. His research has been published in three books, multiple book chapters, as well as articles in *International Studies Quarterly*, *Political Science Quarterly*, *Studies in Conflict and Terrorism*, as well as other journals.

## Scope

- Analysis focuses on Unmanned Aerial Systems (UASs) used by terrorist organizations
- A terrorist organization defined here as one designated such by the U.S. Department of State

# Key Takeaways

- UASs have multiple attractive features for terrorist organizations that make their use increasingly likely
- UASs have been used in surveillance, kinetic strikes, and information warfare roles by terrorists
- Hezbollah, ISIS, Hayat Tahrir al Sham, HAMAS, and Iran-aligned Shia militias in Iraq have all used drones in terrorist attack operations
- The diffused technology marrying UAVs and artificial intelligence will be a force multiplier for terrorist organizations

# Why Are UAVs Attractive to Terrorist Organizations?

- Easy to purchase or acquire technology
- Easy to modify to meet group needs
- Difficult to counter
- Improve deniability
- Big propaganda payoff for the money

- ISR operations
- Kinetic strikes
- Smuggling
- Signal Jamming
- Information Warfare  
(Propaganda)

# What Terrorist Organizations Have Used Drones?

## **Hezbollah**

- Program started in 1997
- ISR, propaganda, lethal kinetic strikes
- Most sophisticated terrorist group drone program
- Iran supported

## **ISIS**

- Program started in 2013
- ISR, propaganda, many lethal kinetic strikes
- Unsophisticated, commercial drones

## **Hayat Tahrir al Sham**

- Program started in 2014
- ISR, propaganda, limited lethal kinetic strikes
- Unsophisticated, commercial drones

# What Terrorist Organizations Have Used Drones?

## **HAMAS**

- Program started in 2003
- ISR, propaganda, attempted kinetic strikes
- Not very sophisticated
- Iran supported

## **Iran-aligned Shia militias in Iraq**

- Program started in 2014
- ISR, propaganda, many lethal kinetic strikes
- Sophisticated
- Iran supported

# Terrorist Groups That Have Had Drone Capacity But Have Not Successfully Deployed Them

- Aum Shinrikyo
- FARC
- Lashkar-e-Taiba
- Haqqani Network
- Al Qaeda

# Sources of Concern about Future Terrorist Drone Use

- Global demand is driving growing supply
- Blurred lines between commercial UAVs and weaponization will continue
- International cooperation on limiting drone availability to terrorists is limited
- Likely impossible to keep increasingly sophisticated drones out of terrorists' hands

# Artificial Intelligence Will Change the UAV Paradigm

- Terrorist groups will have access to artificial intelligence guided drones
- Increases the terrorist UAS threat by many magnitudes
- Will allow terrorists to use swarms of loitering munitions more effectively
- Will allow terrorist to more effectively target elites and crowds
- Will allow terrorists to stay further away from targets in both time and space
